3. TNR PREPARATION

Count 'em	All outdoor cats are eligible! No pets
Feed	Establish regular feeding schedule
When	Decide what day(s) to trap
Veterinarian	Choose clinic location, check SAFCC website
Equipment	Request trap(s), prepare trapping supplies
Recovery	Set up climate-controlled space to hold cats

4. TRAPPER SUPPLIES

Newspaper, newspaper, newspaper
Plastic to put under traps

Trap covers, sheets, towels

Carabiners, twist ties to secure trap doors

Bait, kibble, canned food, chicken, etc.

Tape & marker to label traps

5. TRAPPING DAY

Set traps at regular feeding place and time. Monitor traps 60-90 mins.

Cover and secure trapped cats. If cats don't go in, don't feed them!

If you feed 'em, fix 'em!

6. THINGS TO REMEMBER ABOUT TNR

Keep cats in traps at all times - **no carriers!**
One cat per trap.
Mandatory ear tip.

When trapping, **do not leave any trap unattended.**
Be safe. **NEVER** grab a cat.

Do not release a trapped cat until it has been fixed.
Before surgery, always provide water, no food after midnight.
After surgery, keep cats **24 hours** (longer if needed).
Veterinary re-check if needed.

Cats must be returned to the **original location** where trapped.
